

GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT TESTS (G.E.D.) Under this program an adult writes five tests (English Expression, English Literature, Science, Social Studies, and Mathematics) and if the candidate reaches a set standard, he is issued with a certificate from the Ministry of Education in Victoria stating that he has the equivalent of Grade 12 education. To write the tests, a candidate must meet the following requirements; been out of school for one full academic year, be nineteen years of age, and lived in B. C. for six months. People who are interested in writing these tests may obtain application forms and more information by contacting the Continuing Education Office in Queen Charlotte City or their local co-ordinator.

The Continuing Education Office in Queen Charlotte has G.E.D. test books which are useful in preparing to take the test. The cost is \$6.95. If enough interest were indicated, it is possible that evening classes could be organized to review the basics covered by the G.E.D. Please let us know if you might be interested in further information.

The Northwest Community College has two TELE-COURSES available this year. The courses will be presented in two ways. On the North end of the Islands in Masset, Juskatla, and possibly Dinan Bay the Tele-tapes can be viewed on the local TV channel.

In the communities of Port Clements, Tlell, Queen Charlotte City and Sandspit an evening group viewing will be arranged. Students will probably come to the local school to view the tapes followed by a discussion.

Tutors will be available for these courses and students will have access by phone or will be able to meet with tutors at prearranged times.

Registration will be the same as for other courses, upon receipt of the tuition fee the student will receive a package of material containing textbook, a student manual outlining all the tapes and how to use them.

- 1. Freehand Sketching; package will contain 1 textbook, 1 student manual, a sketch pad and a pencil.
- 2. Designing Home Interiors; package will contain 3 textbooks and a student manual.

There are 30 Tele-tapes with each course. The course cost has not been finalized but further details will be available before registration night.

FISHING MASTER CLASS IV CERTIFICATE PREPARATION (M.O.T. CERTIFICATION)
