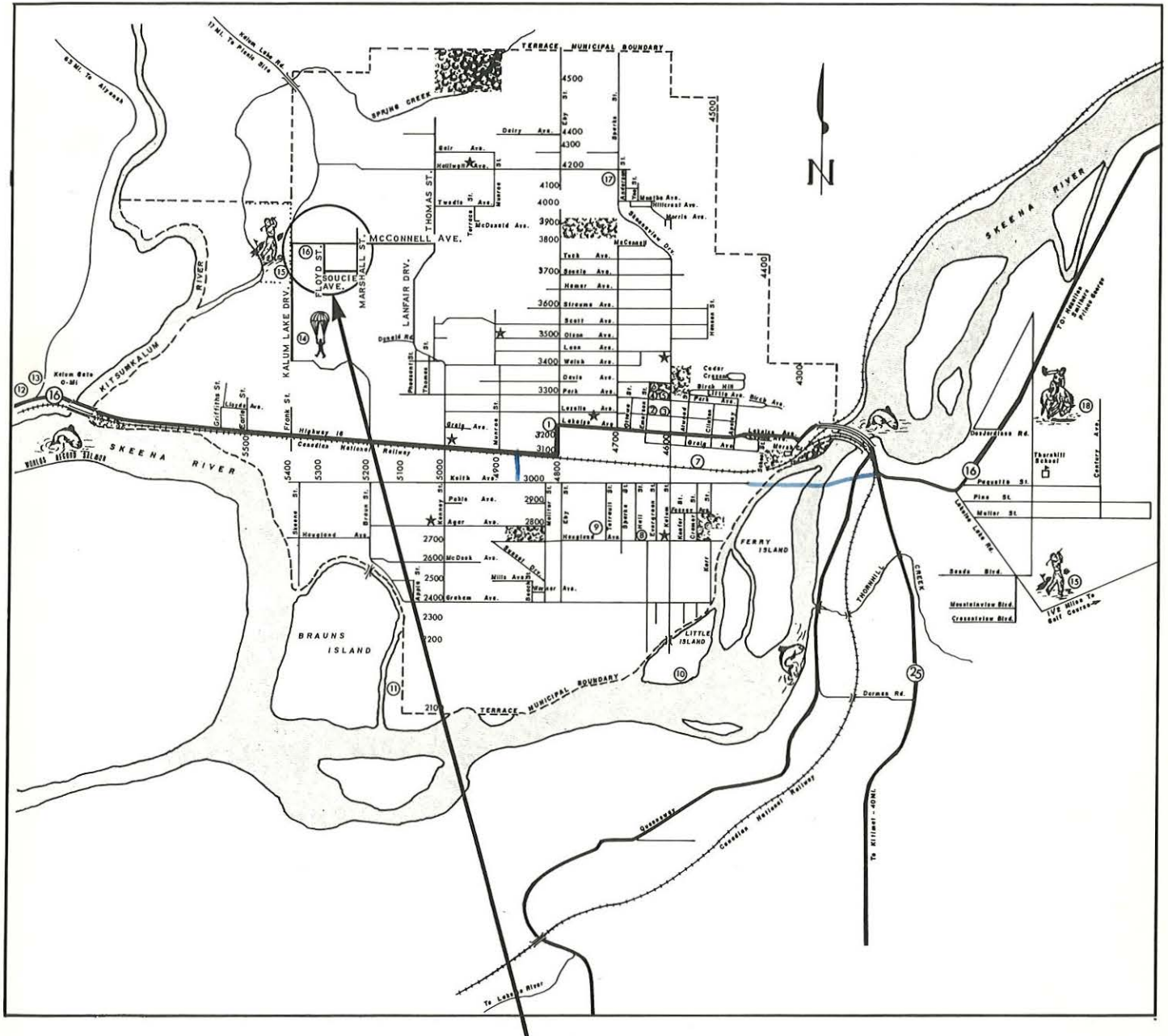

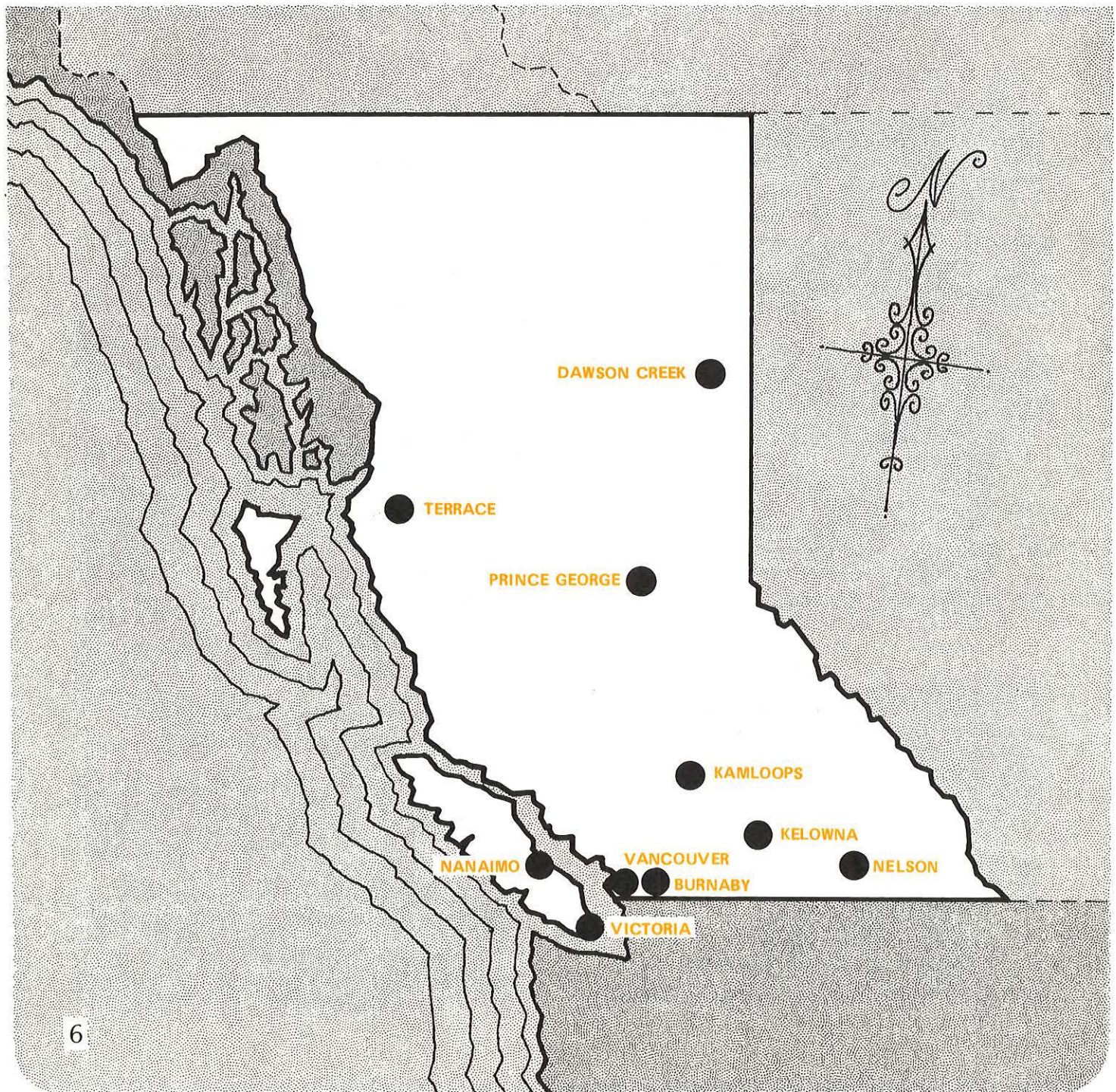



It is the aim of this programme to upgrade individuals academically in as short a period of time as possible to enable them to qualify for employment or for enrolment in specific vocational training programmes.

There are three main areas of study:
Communicative English, Applied Mathematics,
and Basic Science.

The programme offers training to three levels:

- a) up to grade 8 equivalency
- b) up to grade 10 equivalency
- * c) up to grade 12 equivalency.

Completion certificates may be awarded at various grade levels in each subject.

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COMMERCIAL advanced options and upgrading

This programme consists of a variety of individual courses designed for persons who have had previous training or experience in general office work, and wish to upgrade their knowledge and occupational skills.

Students may select two or more from the following: machine transcription, advanced typing, advanced shorthand, intermediate bookkeeping, machine bookkeeping, industrial payroll, legal sec-

retarial practice, medical secretarial practice and key punch operating. All schools however do not offer the entire range of courses and students are advised to contact the school concerned for specific details. Official typing and shorthand tests will be given so that students may attain certification in these areas.

This programme runs continuously, and applicants are accepted monthly as vacancies occur.



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Commercial General

This course offers the student the possibility of two areas of training...clerk-typist and clerk-stenographer. The clerk-typist option is offered only at Burnaby, and Dawson Creek, B.C.

Individual students will be counselled into the most appropriate area for their particular abilities and aptitudes after enrolment in the course.

A student training as a clerk-typist will take recordkeeping and bookkeeping in addition to the

common subjects —typing, filing, business machines, office practice, and Business English and Correspondence, whilst a student training as a clerk-stenographer will take shorthand.

Many employment opportunities exist in the business world for clerical workers, and it is relatively easy for those with adequate education and training to find a position.

Commercial Secretarial

Secretaries have many varied duties to perform during the course of a working day, such as answering the phone, making business appointments for the employer, taking dictation and typing the transcriptions, keeping records, personally answering routine mail, and performing receptionist duties.

The content of this course is designed to give the student experience in the above areas, and

includes business English, office etiquette, typing, recordkeeping, shorthand and transcription, plus the operation of various business machines.

Much of the work performed by a secretary is confidential, therefore the person who follows this vocation must have the personal attributes of discretion, loyalty and responsibility. She must be pleasant in manner, and exemplify efficiency in all matters relative to her position.

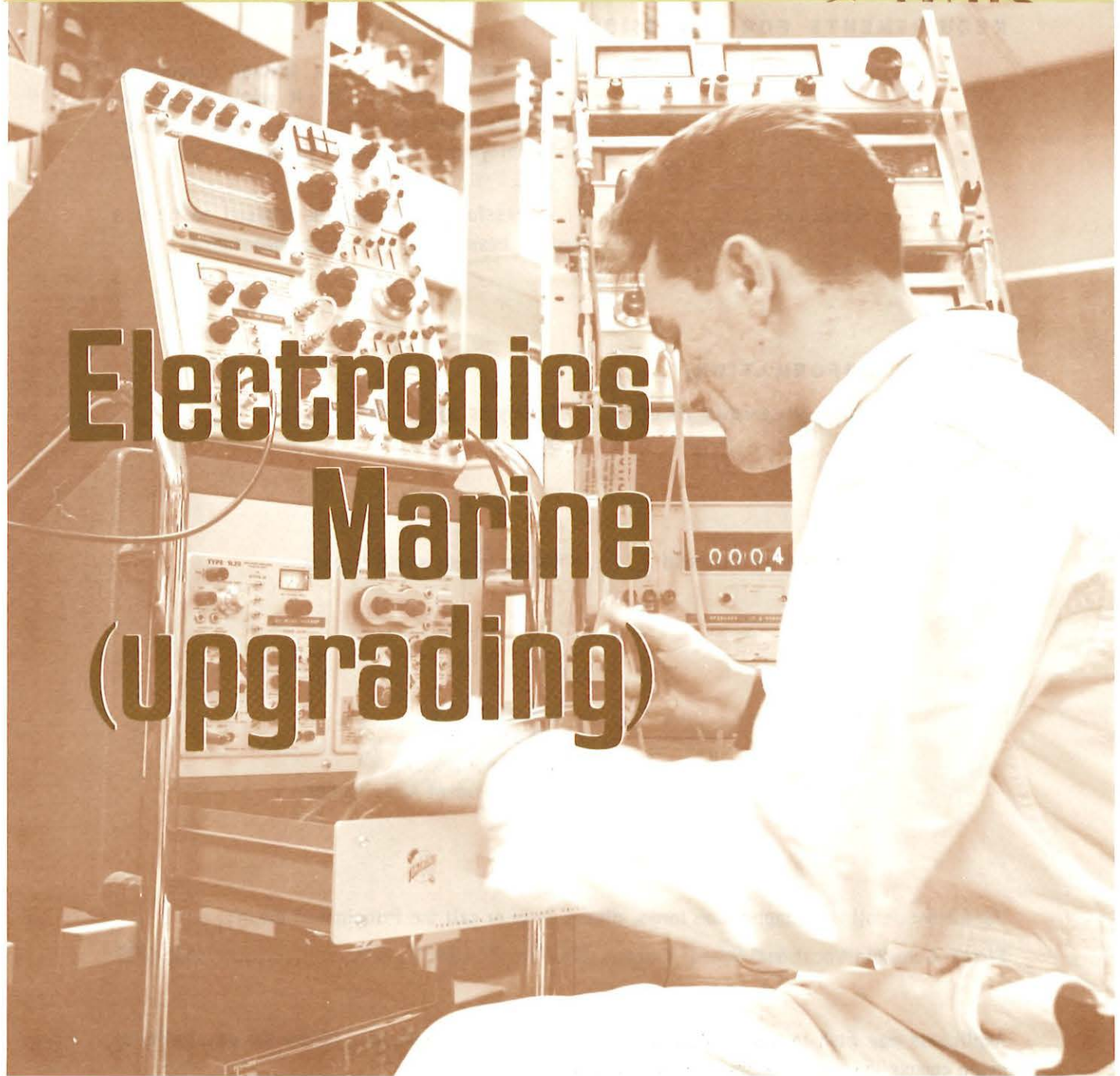

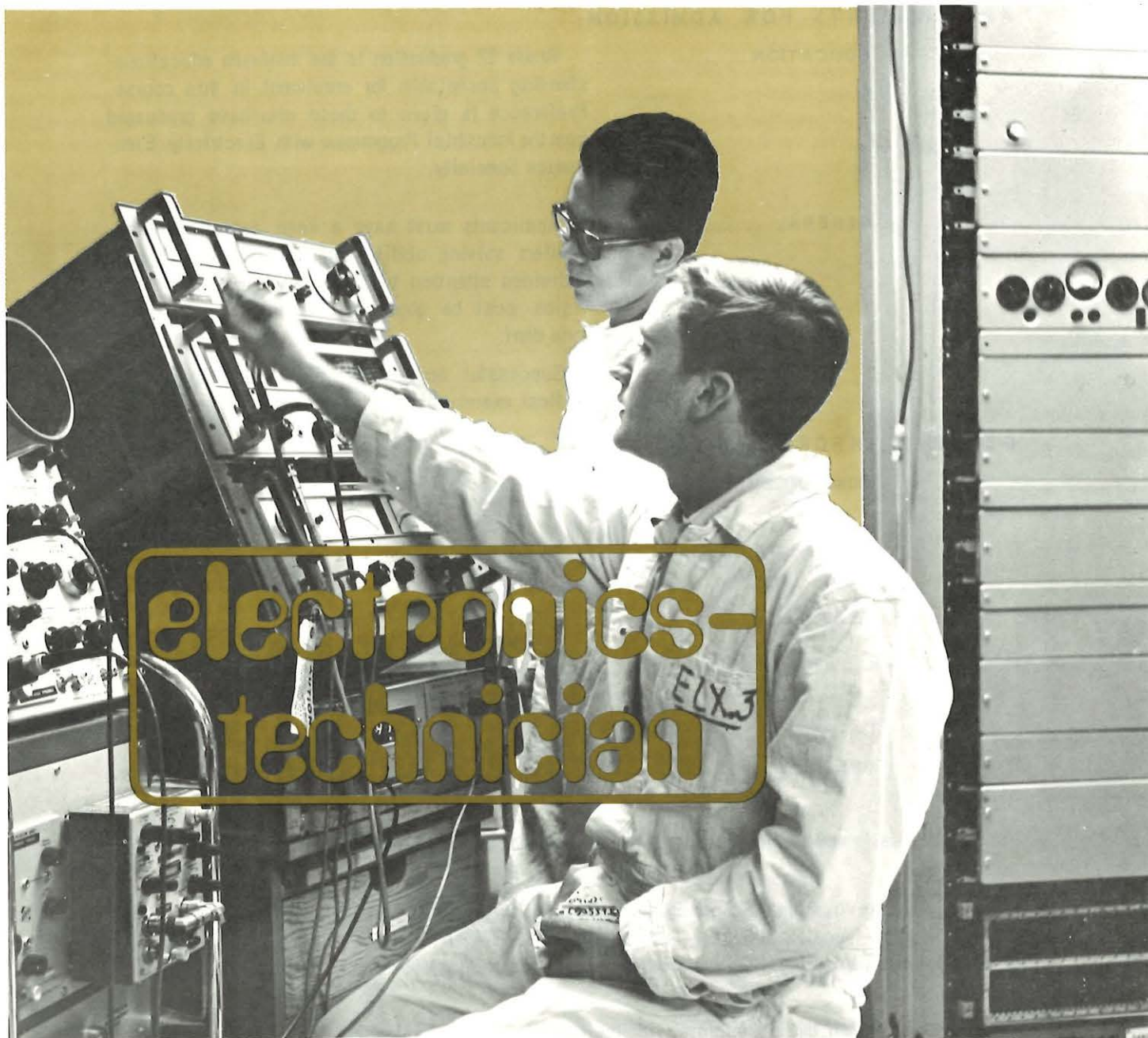

An electronics technician is concerned with installing, adjusting, testing and checking complicated circuits and apparatus, therefore he must have a thorough knowledge and clear understanding of electronic theory and practice, and must keep himself informed on all the latest developments.

This course takes the student through a natural progression of technical knowledge and applied skills. Subject matter includes basic electronics theory and practice, tube and solid state circuit analysis, microwave systems, systems analysis, digital and pulse techniques and computer systems.

Electronics equipment is not only steadily becoming more complex but is being used more and more by Canadian industries. Employment opportunities are extensive and exist with manufacturers of electronic equipment; in radio and television transmitting studios; in the aircraft industry; in research and testing laboratories of private companies and government establishments; and on the installation of electro medical apparatus, telecommunication systems, radar and navigational equipment.

Welding is an industrial art in a highly competitive field. It requires constant physical coordination of arms, hands, eye and brain and the welder develops manipulative skills through manual training. Basic metallurgy, heat treatment, blueprint reading, plate and pipe layout, applied mathematics and principles of safety education are some of the technical subjects covered while several welding procedures are applied to various types of metal. On completion of the course a student will have gained sufficient practical experience and related theory to take a welding test under the A.S.M.E. sec. IX, C.S.A. - W-47,

or A.W.S. Codes. These are recognized standards of qualification acceptable to industry.

The welding trade is universal in its application. Construction welding appeals to certain men due to the variety of working locations, while other welders prefer to remain in the industrial centres, where employment opportunities occur in practically every mechanical or metal trade.

Due to technological developments, welding equipment and techniques are constantly changing, thus a welder, though employed, should constantly strive to update his skills.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION:

Welding upgrading training is confined to persons presently or recently employed in welding, who wish to improve their techniques or become proficient in special processes, or who are approved for the following certification; A.S.M.E. sec. IX, C.S.A. - W-47, or A.W.S. Codes.

Persons requiring Provincial Government Certification are required to apply to the Welding Inspector, Department of Public Works, for assessment of their credentials. The Inspector may stipulate a certain length of time for instruction before taking the test. The testing appointment will be arranged by the Chief Welding Instructor of the school.

Applicants must be healthy and free from defective vision, hearing and respiration. If the training period is to be in excess of six days duration, applicants will be required to present a Health Certificate and proof of a recent Chest X-ray.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Upgrading runs continuously and may be taken at each school as space becomes available.

Length of training time will be variable for each trainee, in accordance with the Welding Inspector's recommendation.
