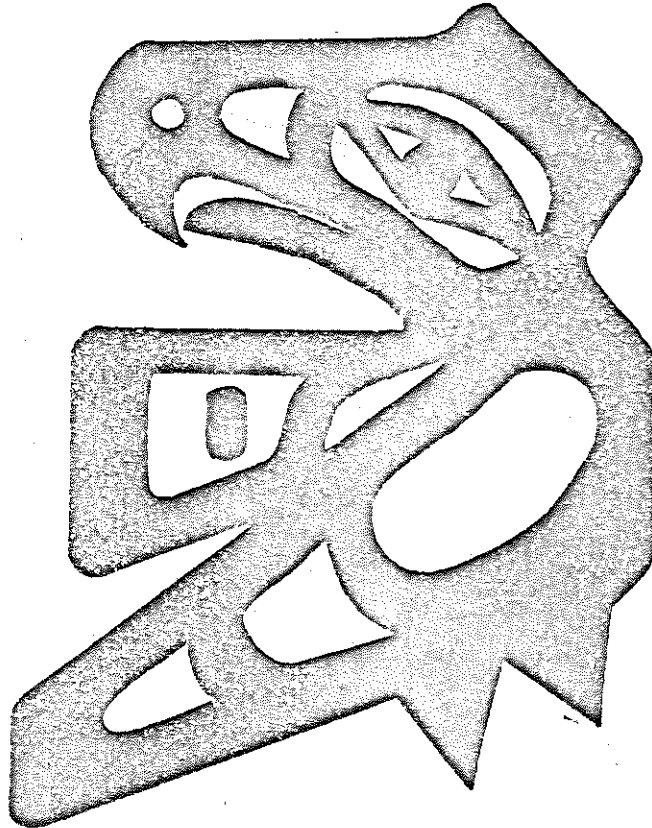

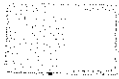

DESIGNING HOME INTERIORS

An introductory study of the basic principles of interior design. The course was created specifically for both men and women of all ages and all locales. This telecourse emphasizes the planning of residential interiors so that they will satisfy individual and family needs, values and lifestyles. Consumer education regarding the selection of home furnishing materials is also stressed, and valuable consumer tips are offered. Designing home interiors can help you to effectively plan your own home environment, whether a mobile home, apartment, single family dwelling or condominium. The student learns the basic principles of interior design by means of a variety of instructional devices - reading the print resources, viewing the 30 half-hour television programs, carrying out a range of assignments including design projects, and self-testing. These combine to form the coordinated instructional system that makes up a telecourse. Since interior design is primarily a visual skill, the use of colour televised instructional material is particularly appropriate and effective. Designing home interiors is a course which can be taken just for your interest and enjoyment.
