CLASS LIMITS



Vocational and Trades Training

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN VOCATIONAL TRAINING: In response to individual student needs, a more flexible training system has been set up. The Vocational Division is presently developing course materials into package modules to ensure maximum flexibility for individualized training. This new system will allow students to enter programs at various times to progress according to their abilities. To accommodate this versatility in training, it is essential for students in vocational training to apply as early as possible to gain entry into the program.

FULL-TIME COURSES

FEES: General structure for new entry courses:

Tuition \$22.50 per month
Tool & Book Deposit \$50.00 (refundable)
Student Association \$1.00 per month

Courses presently offered are:

a) Cook Training

b) Welding

c) General Mechanics (starting in April)

BUSINESS CAREERS PROGRAMS: Courses begin on the first Monday of every second month beginning January 4, 1982. Courses are offered in:

Clerk-Typist 4 - 6 months
Clerk-Bookkeeper 4 - 6 months
Accounting 9 - 11 months
Medical Steno 10 months
Legal Steno 10 months

INDUSTRIAL RECORDS AND FIRST AID: To provide instruction in the maintenance of industrial records and to enable students to obtain a Class "C" certificate for Industrial First Aid. Opportunities are generally found in all industries which employ Timekeepers certified to perform first aid duties. Those holding industrial first aid tickets which require renewal may enrol. START DATE: Feb. 1

DURATION: 5 months

COOK TRAINING PROGRAMS: Program will have continuous intake. The objective of Cook Training is to prepare students in all the basic skills necessary to gain employment in the Hospitality industry. For students who have an interest in working with the general public and a desire for permanent gainful employment. Opportunities are plentiful for graduates.

GENERAL MECHANICS: This ten-month pre-employment program is intended to prepare the student for employment in the mechanical field. On successful completion of this course, the student will have a basic knowledge of all phases of mechanics with training equal to pre-apprentice Heavy Duty Mechanics, Automotive Mechanics, and pre-employment Marine Engine Mechanics.

START DATE: Continuous intake beginning in April (approx.). DURATION: 10 months UPGRADING: The Vocational Division also offers courses in upgrading:

a) Welding

GENERAL WELDING: General Welding will be following the Provincial Outline closely. At the present time, the "C" Module Outline is complete and is being taught. The self-paced Module "C" will take approximately eight months for the average student to complete.

ELECTRONICS TECHNICIAN: To prepare for a career in one of the following areas:

Electronic Communications — Industrial Electronics
Digital Electronics — TV Servicing
Radio, Audio Electronics — Video Tape Servicing
Micro-computer/Microprocessors

START DATE: February, if sufficient enrollment is obtained. DURATION: 10 months

MARINE EMERGENCY DUTIES (MED 1): A safety-oriented course for small vessel operators and crew. This course, designed by the Canadian Coast Guard (Ship's Safety Branch) specifically for the small boat operator and fishermen, consists of the practical and theoretical application of life saving, survival, fire fighting and seamanship. An MOT certificate will be issued on completion of the course. Note: This certificate is a requirement for the Fishing Master III - IV certificate of competency. FEE: \$40.00

DURATION: 4 - 5 days, offered dependent upon student registrations.

WILDERNESS GUIDING SKILLS: This is a very intensive three-week course designed to aid people planning to work in the guiding and hunting field. The student will learn Horse Use and Care, Hunting, Natural History and Non-Hunting Uses, Emergency Training, Orienteering and Survival, Boating Skills, and Camp and Trail Cooking.





MORE ABOUT THE ARTISTS.....

Photographer Jim Breuklman of West Vancouver was born in Trinidad. He received his BFA in photography and design from the Rhode Island School of Design, and he has also studied industrial design. He has been teaching at the Vancouver School of Art (ECCA) since 1967 in both the photography course and first year Foundation programs. In 1977 he ran a photography course at the Banff Centre of Fine Arts. From 1966 to 1973 he ran his own photographic and design studio in Vancouver.

His work has been recognized in major publications and exhibitions. His "Distance" series, exhibited in a solo show at the Helen Pitt Gallery, was published in Camera International in October 1977. In 1978 he had a solo show of photo-sculpture at the Nova Gallery, Vancouver; he was represented in the Canadian Portrait Show at the Edmonton Art Gallery, and included in "Colour Cast" (the work of six photographers including three from ECCA) which toured B.C., Alberta and Manitoba. He has conducted photography workshops for the Outreach Program.

James Thornbury has been splitting his time between his studio at Hornby Island, British Columbia, where he now lives and the University of Saskatchewan where he taught from 1970 to 1979. He has a BA in art education from Western Washington State College and an MA in pottery from Central Washington State College. Recent exhibitions in British Columbia have included a touring group show "Major Saskatchewan Artists" at the Art Gallery of Greater Vancouver, "Two from Hornby Island" at the Malaspina Art Gallery, and "James Thornsbury - Realism and Fantasy" at the Pottery Gallery in Vancouver. Among his awards was the "Best Avant Garde Award" at the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto, 1975. He has taught Summer School courses in ceramics at the Emily Carr School of Art; his work has been shown across North America and is represented in the permanent collections of the National Museum of Modern Art in Kyoto, Japan.




