

G.E.D.--GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT TESTS (Grade 12 Equivalency)

The General Education Development tests provide an opportunity for adults who did not graduate from secondary school to acquire an official document stating that they have Grade 12 equivalency standing. This may assist you in qualifying for better jobs, for promotion, and in passuing further training. Candidates must meet the following requirements: be 19 years of age or older, have been out of school for at least one full year, and have lived in British Columbia for at least six months.

G.E.D. Prep


