

### Financial Aid

Sponsorship, student grants, student loans, bursaries, scholarships are available. Sponsorship by Canada Employment or Ministry of Labour is limited to some vocational programs. Canada Student Loans and B.C. Loans are available to all students dependent upon need. The College's Financial Awards Committee administers up to \$10,000 in bursaries and scholarships eac year.
