NORTHWEST COMMUNITY COLLEGE

IN KITIMAT

ADMISSION POLICY: Course offerings are open to anyone interested. Secondary school diploma is not required. During registration hours, Instructors will assist students in selecting courses suitable to their individual goals.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

COURSE OFFERINGS (UNIVERSITY TRANSFER)

Fees: \$25.50 per term per course; \$51.00 for two-term courses.

MONDAY

Mathematics 101/102

An introduction to the concepts, techniques and applications of differential and integral calculus, with an introduction to linear algebra.

Art 101/102

Design Fundamentals: the student is introduced to various techniques, skills and theory of design. Composition, basic design theory and graphics are the major areas of investigation. The course progresses from design form in two dimensions to a preparation for sculptural forms.

TUESDAY

Haisla Language 151/152

Instruction in Haisla Language. (This course will be taught in Kitamaat Village. Not university transferable.)

Sociology 101/102

A study of social structures, primarily in Canada. We will ask how things got the way they are. Emphasis on trade union development, growth of corporations, comparison with production in other countries. Depending on student interest, discussion of native land claims and women's issues will be included.

WEDNESDAY

Biology 101/102

Topics discussed in this course include the role of science in society, the geological history of the earth in relation to life, the development of evolutionary theory and genetics, properties of atoms and molecules, cellular respiration, photosynthesis, embryonic development, hormones and physiological mechanisms.

Psychology 101/102

Introduction to psychology: includes topics such as a brief history of psychology, elementary experimental design, the nervous system, sensation and perception, intelligence and testing, mental health and behavioural disorders.

Ceramics 163/164

A general introduction to ceramics, using clay as a medium. (Not university transferable).

THURSDAY

French 103/104

Simple grammatical constructions and syntax are developed in the context of idiomatic French, using an active audiolingual method. Selected readings in French literature form part of the material in this course.

Geography 101/103

An introduction to the development, structure, concepts and methods of modern geography. The theory and concepts of regional geography as applied to Canada. Emphasis is given to contemporary problems of regional development.

Journalism 151

How to write and edit for newspapers. Special emphasis on Trade Union journalism. (Reporting contract negotiations, disputes, and analysis of work place). Course will be responsive to special needs of students: (e.g. woman's journalism, journalism for Native people and Ethnic groups). (This is not a university transferable course).

PRE-SCHOOL SUPERVISION TRAINING COURSE OFFERINGS

This programme is designed for those who wish to qualify as daycare, nursery school or private kindergarten supervisors in pre-school centres. The successful completion of 8 courses is required for licensing by Community Care Facilities Licensing Division. Admission requirements include secondary graduation, or equivalent or acceptance under mature students regulations. Records of previous education, a certificate of good health, and a TB X-ray clearance report should be brought to the first class.

NOTE: This course is offered in Terrace only. Kitimat residents are welcome to attend.

Principles and Practices

An introduction to planning and development of programmes for Early Childhood Centres. Basic principles and methods of guidance, facilities and equipment, the importance of play and its potential for learning and the role of parent and teacher will be studied. This course will include lab work in Music, Art, Language and Literature, Science and Social Studies, and focus on presentation of the curriculum as an integrated whole.

HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC AND UPGRADING COURSES

The following courses will be offered at Night School if the response is sufficient. All these courses will carry High School Creditation.

H-1 Basic Mathematics

This is a preparatory course for those who, in the future, wish to take Math 11 and 12 or for students who intend on writing the Grade XII Equivalency exam. The course is also designed for any person who wishes to brush-up on basic mathematic functions.
