GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (G.E.D. TESTS)

The G.E.D. tests are a series of five tests in English, Math, Science and Social Studies. They provide an opportunity for many adults who did not graduate from Secondary School to acquire an official document stating that they have a grade XII secondary school equivalency standing. This may assist you in qualifying for better jobs, for promotions, and in applying for admission to post secondary educational institutions.

Cost of these tests are \$5.00 for the series. Applicants must be 19 years of age and older and out of school for one year.
