#### **Admission Policy**

We have an "open door" admission policy. You do not have to be a high school graduate to enter college courses. Courses are designed for adults who wish to further their intellectual interests and who may have long since been out of formal schooling, as well as for recent high school graduates. The College promotes the concept of "lifelong learning" and is sensitive to the particular educational needs of women, workers, and native people. Our instructors are aware that many students are on shift work at Alcan and Eurocan, and are prepared to be fléxible in this regard. All Arts and Science courses are University transferable EXCEPT WHERE OTHERWISE NOTED. University transfer means that upon successful completion of the course you will receive academic credit.
