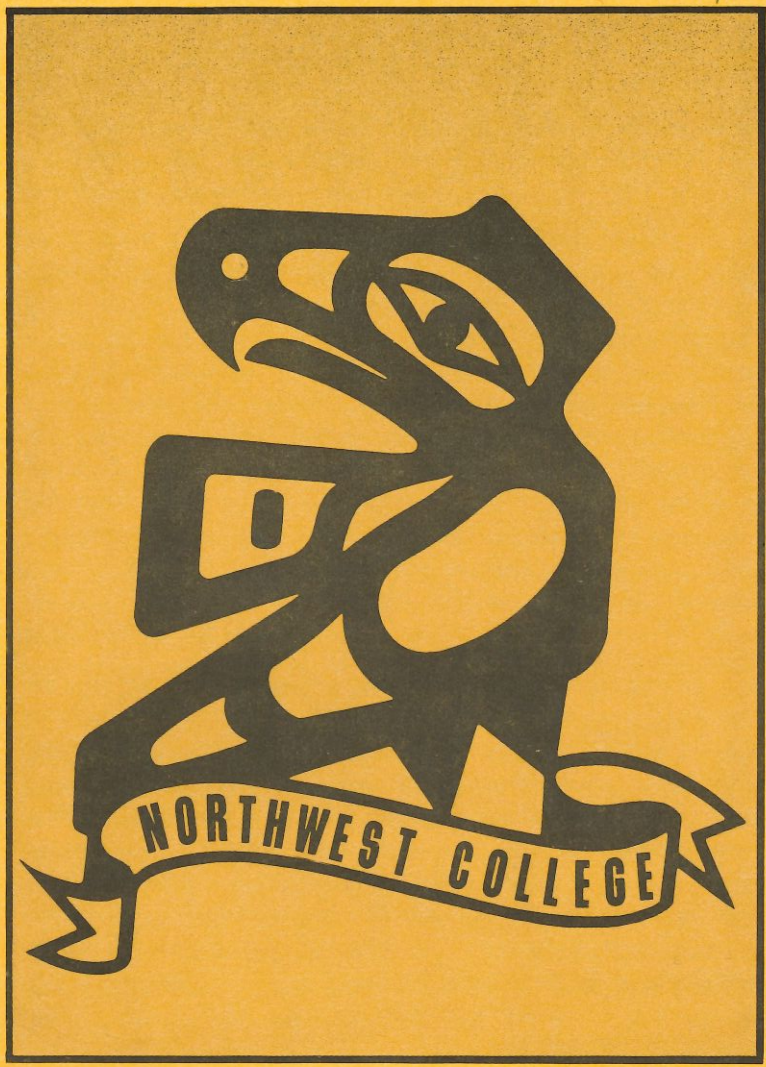

Message from the Principal

The purpose of this small brochure is to bring to your attention the educational services being offered by Northwest Community College.

Northwest Community College is endeavouring to be a community college in the broadest sense of the words. In other words, we wish to serve as many of the educational needs of our community as possible. Our geographical area of operation spreads over six school districts and ranges from the Queen Charlotte Islands in the west to the Smithers School District in the east, with the Nishga, Terrace, Kitimat, and Prince Rupert School Districts in between. The problems inherent in trying to serve a population as widely distributed as ours are very considerable. But they are also a challenge, and we prefer to look on our task as a very worthwhile challenge to be met rather than as a problem.

As can be seen from the perusal of this brochure, we are at least beginning to meet the challenge. A good start has been made to serve the needs of all the people in our communities, those who require trades training, those who want vocational training, those who wish to pursue a university education, and those who simply want general interest courses and courses to help them in their overall educational development. Vocational and Trades Training Programs

Northwest College offers the following full-time Vocational and Trades training programs. Many of these programs run year round and are scheduled, where possible, to meet employment and seasonal needs.

Automotive Mechanical Repair

- a 5-month pre-apprenticeship program with classes beginning in January and July.

Basic Training for Skill Development

- a varying length upgrading program which provides

the academic background necessary for specific vocational programs and employment. Students enrol as space comes available.

Business Careers Programs

- these 5 to 10-month pre-employment programs lead to certificates in Accounting, Bookkeeping, Typing, Secretarial Stenography, Medical Stenography, or Industrial Records and First Aid. Students may begin at bi-monthly intakes.

Carpentry and Joinery

- a 5½-month pre-apprenticeship program beginning in April and September; 4-week apprentice classes as scheduled with the Ministry of Labour.

Cook Training

- a 12-month pre-employment program; students enrol in January, April, July, and September. Upgrading is offered as space is available.

Electronics Technician

- a 10-month pre-employment program; starts in January and September; upgraders may enrol as space is available.

Fisherman's Upgrade

- a 6-week upgrade program offered in December and January.

Heavy Duty Mechanics

- a 5½-month pre-apprenticeship program; starts in April and October; 4-week apprentice classes as scheduled with the Ministry of Labour.

Marine Engine Repair

- a 10-month pre-employment program; starts each September.

Welding

- a 10-month pre-employment program; starts September; upgraders may enrol as space is available.

Occupational Orientation

- a 4 to 6-week program developed to assist persons in identifying occupational goals. Emphasis is placed on Career Planning, Training availability, and self exploration in relation to an occupation.

Note: The extra selection of these courses at the Terrace Centre are accommodating our full time first year university transfer students from throughout the region.

Special Programs

Early Childhood Education

— This 9-month, full-time program encompasses the theory and practical experience necessary to earn provincial certification as a daycare supervisor.

Labour Education

— The Labour Studies program offers short courses, seminars, and workshops designed to offer useful understanding to persons interested or engaged in all aspects of practical trade union work.

Native Studies

— This program offers an opportunity for Native people to undertake the first two years of a university program while maintaining their management functions in their community. General interest courses relating to Native culture in the Northwest region are being offered as they are developed.

Women's Studies

— This program is offering workshops and seminars designed for women throughout the College region.

Admission Requirements

Vocation and Trades Training Programs

In general, an applicant must

- a) be 17 years of age or over.
- b) have completed grade 12 or its equivalent — some programs will accept students with grade 10 or equivalent even though grade 11 or 12 is recommended — applicants with less than the stated level for a program can obtain academic upgrading, to the required level, at the College in the Basic Training for Skill Development program.

University Transfer Program

In general the College does not require a specific academic background for admission to this program. In a few cases, a program may require pre-requisites — this does not mean that a student is disbarred, but rather, that his chances for success at this point are limited and that permission to enter may be required.

Fees

Tuition: \$25.50 per 3-credit course (maximum \$125 per semester)
Student Activity: \$1.00 per month

Student Services

Counselling

The College has a facility to offer interested persons and students a variety of career, vocational and educational information. Persons wishing advice or information on other institutions in the province should contact their local Co-ordinator or the Registrar in Terrace.

Financial Aid

Northwest College is an eligible institution for Canada Student Loans and a variety of scholarships and grants. Many students in full-time vocational programs are eligible for sponsorship through Canada Manpower.

Library

The College library loans books and reference material to students throughout the College region. Students wishing to borrow books should contact the co-ordinator in their region for listings of the library holdings and information on how to borrow these books.

Housing

Full-time students in Terrace are able to take advantage of very reasonably priced room and board in the dormitories.
