

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

BASIC TRAINING AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT (B.T.S.D.)

This is an individualized vocational Math and English upgrading program operated throughout the college. Fulltime and during the day, it is for persons 17 years of age and older who have been out of school for one year.

Cost \$15.00 per month.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

The Ministry of Education provides 'Education by Mail' courses up to and including Grade 12, at a cost of \$15.00 per course. Vocational courses are also available. There are a few courses that can be taken for general interest at no cost.

Many Canadian Universities provide correspondence courses up to and including 4th year university in a variety of programmes at an approximate cost of \$125.00 per course.
