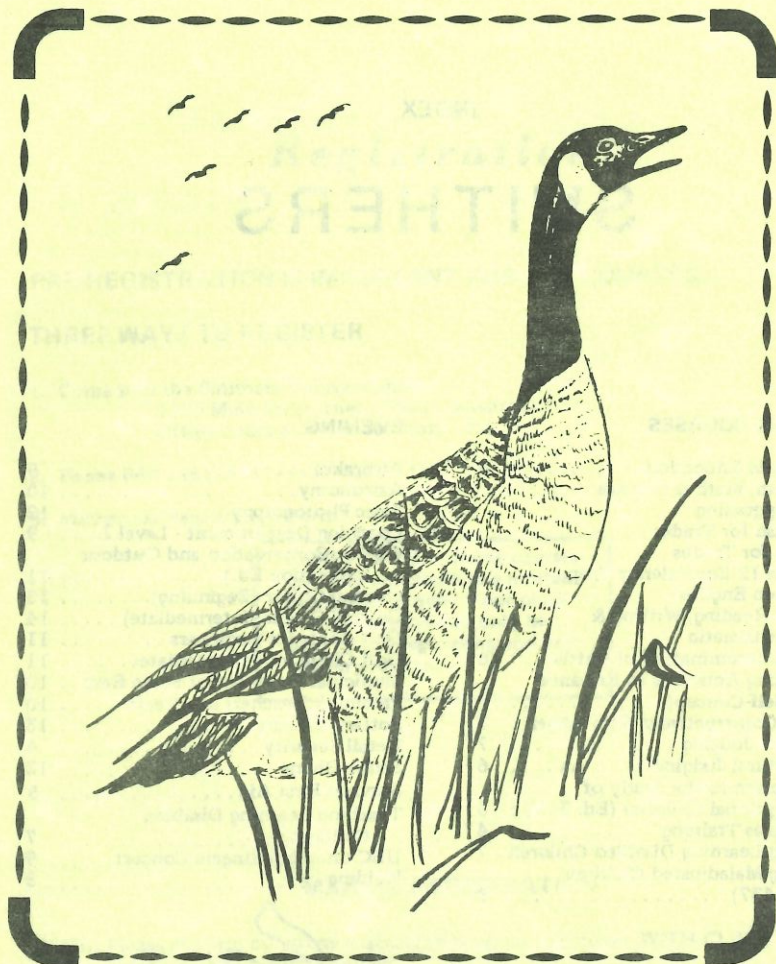

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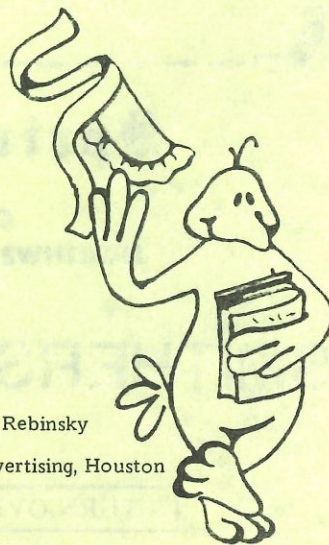

Important Information

FEES for courses that do not have class limits must be paid by the 2nd class of the course. People are welcome to sample first classes of non-limited long courses. Fees for courses that have class limits must be prepaid to ensure your place. Registration is free of charge to Senior Citizens but material costs, where applicable, still apply. Receipts totalling over \$25.00 are income tax deductible. Please retain fee receipts.

REFUNDS - A complete refund is made only when a course is cancelled. A percentage refund is made when students must withdraw from a course because of special circumstances. A no refund policy is imposed on a few courses that can only accommodate limited numbers and are heavily demanded. The College reserves the right to change fees without notice, to limit registrations in any program or to cancel or revise any of the courses listed.

Pre-registration is important for all courses. If we don't know you are planning to attend we may cancel your course because we think there will not be sufficient enrollment. Phone us at 847-4461.

SHIFTY COURSES - The course content is straight but the scheduling is flexible to allow shift workers to participate. Watch for courses that show both day and evening classes. You may attend the day sessions when you are working evenings and then change to the evening sessions when you are working days.

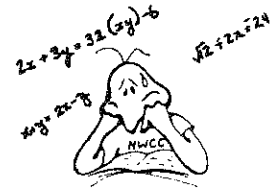

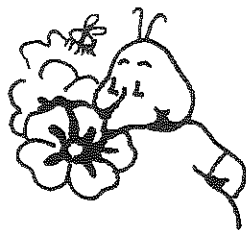

SIMON FRASER UNIVERSITY PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM TEACHER TRAINING

In September 1980, Simon Fraser University is again planning to offer its Professional Development Program (PDP) in Terrace.

WHAT IS SFU'S PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM?

It is a three semester (twelve month) teacher training program which allows students to acquire most of the necessary teacher education in or near their home communities. The first semester (401/402) is a combination of seminar work and practical experiences in a Terrace classroom. The second semester (405) is a full four-month teaching practicum. The third semester is taken at SFU in Burnaby and is comprised of courses selected by the student. These courses may be offered by the Faculty of Education or other departments allowing a student to build on strengths and eliminate weaknesses.

WHAT TEACHING CERTIFICATE WILL BE GRANTED UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE PDP?

Students entering PDP after completing 60 semester hours of academic credit will be eligible for the Standard Teaching Certificate which will allow them to teach at the elementary school level. Following the PDP, a student could return to SFU to work toward his B.Ed. degree.

Students who enter after a Bachelor's degree will be eligible for a Professional Teaching Certificate. This will allow them to teach at either the elementary or secondary level.

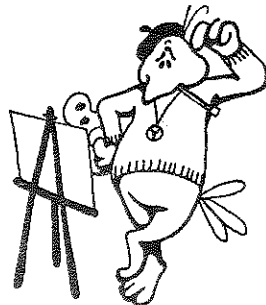
