# Important Information

FEES for courses that do not have class limits must be paid by the 2nd class of the course, People are welcome to sample first classes of non-limited long courses. Fees for courses that have class limits must be prepaid to ensure your place. Registration is free of charge to Senior Citizens but material costs, where applicable, still apply. Receipts totalling over \$25.00 are income tax deductible. Please retain fee receipts.

REFUNDS - A complete refund is made only when a course is cancelled. A percentage refund is made when students must withdraw from a course because of special circumstances. A no refund policy is imposed on a few courses that can only accomodate limited numbers and are heavily demanded. 


