PRE-REGISTRATION - LET US KNOW YOU'RE COMING OR THE COURSE YOU WANT MAY BE CANCELLED BECAUSE OF LOW ENROLLMENT. WE'RE ONLY A PHONE CALL AWAY!

CLASS LIMITS - Some courses can only take a limited number of people. Your place in these courses will ONLY be held by pre-registration and payment of the fee. If you are registering by mail confirm availability of space in courses with class limits BEFORE mailing in registration fees. A 'no refund' policy applies to these courses.

FEES will be collected at the first class. Courses with 'class limits' must be prepaid to ensure your place. All course fees must be paid no later than the second class.

SENIOR CITIZENS - Registration fees are free-of-charge. Material costs, where applicable, still apply.

INCOME TAX - Receipts totalling over \$25.00 are income tax deductible so keep your fee receipts.

REFUNDS - A complete refund is made only when a course is cancelled. A percentage refund is made when a student must withdraw from a course because of special circumstances. A no refund policy is imposed on class limit courses. The College reserves the right to change fees without notice, to limit registrations in any program or to cancel or revise any of the courses listed.

SHIFTY COURSES - The course content is straight but the scheduling is flexible to allow shift workers to participate. Watch for courses that show both day and evening classes. You may attend the day sessions when you are working evenings and then change to the evening sessions when you are working days.

COUNSELLING - The College Counsellor visits Houston on the first Tuesday of each month. He is available to both secondary students and adults to discuss any questions they may have regarding further education or career plans. Phone the College Centre at **845-7266** to arrange an appointment.

LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE - Library and resource materials are catalogued at the Houston College Centre. The Learning Resource Centre is open to students and instructors of Northwest Community College. Reference materials located at the College may be used at the Centre. There is a nominal fee for this service.


HOUSTON ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

ENGLISH, MATH AND SCIENCE UPGRADING

AFTERNOON OR EVENING

For adults who did not complete secondary school these concentrated courses will allow them to acquire the necessary skills to gain grade 10 or grade 12 standing

for entrance into vocational or trades training in the shortest possible time. Adults work on individualized programs tailored to their goals. Each student begins at their own level and works at their own speed. College certificates are awarded for successful completion of Level 2 (grade 8), Level 3 (grade 10), and Level 4 (grade 12). You may enroll at any time as space permits and attend two afternoon or two evening classes per week.



Shift Workers - Please note that you may alternate between Adult Basic Education day and evening classes to suit your work schedule.

GRADE 12 EQUIVALENCY PREPARATION

AFTERNOON OR EVENING

For adults who did not complete secondary school and wish to acquire a Ministry of Education Grade 12 equivalency certificate under the General Education Development Programme. Adults are required to pass five tests: english literature, english grammar, science, social studies, and mathematics. These classes will help you to prepare for the tests. FULL-TIME VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS IN TERRACE

Did you know that a number of full-time Vocational Programs begin in January and February? The following programs are offered in Terrace:

Industrial Records and First Aid

(5 months - Start date: February 2)

Students enrolled in this program will receive training in general clerical skills such as business machines, office procedures, typing, payroll and timekeeping, accounting and accident prevention. A large portion of the program is in preparing students to be examined for the Industrial "C" First Aid ticket. Graduates will find employment as camp clerks, payroll departments, industrial relations officers, safety officers in combination with first aid duties.

General Welding

(10 months - Start date: February 2)

This course covers areas such as safety trade theory and practices, oxyacetylene welding and cutting procedures and arc welding techniques with emphasis on metallurgy blue print reading, sketching and layout in plate and structional fabrication. Practical projects are designed and involve layout, assembly and welding to specific measurements and tolerances. The shop work is designed to simulate working conditions and training equipment is kept current to meet industrial standards. Upon successful completion of the 10 month General Welding program, the student will receive a diploma with eligibility to test to a D.P.W. #3 and D.P.W. #4. (For further information contact Mr. E. Marine Engine Repair

(10 months - Start date: February 2)

This program provides training on current equipment used in the marine engine mechanics field. It will include training in two and four stroke gasoline and diesel engines as well as in major propulsion systems. Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to diagnose and repair all major components of marine engine systems as well as other small engines such as snowmobiles, chain saws, lawnmowers, etc.
