PRE-REGISTRATION - LET US KNOW YOU'RE COMING OR THE COURSE YOU WANT MAY BE CANCELLED BECAUSE OF LOW ENROLLMENT. WE'RE ONLY A PHONE CALL AWAY!

CLASS LIMITS - Some courses can only take a limited number of people. Your place in these courses will ONLY be held by pre-registration and payment of the fee. If you are registering by mail confirm availability of space in courses with class limits BEFORE mailing in registration fees. A 'no refund' policy applies to these courses.

FEES will be collected at the first class. Courses with 'class limits' must be prepaid to ensure your place. All course fees must be paid no later than the second class.

SENIOR CITIZENS - Registration fees are free-of-charge. Material costs, where applicable, still apply.

INCOME TAX - Receipts totalling over \$25.00 are income tax deductible so keep your fee receipts.

REFUNDS - A complete refund is made only when a course is cancelled. A percentage refund is made when a student must withdraw from a course because of special circumstances. A no refund policy is imposed on class limit courses. The College reserves the right to change fees without notice, to limit registrations in any program or to cancel or revise any of the courses listed.

SHIFTY COURSES • The course content is straight but the scheduling is flexible to allow shift workers to participate. Watch for courses that show both day and evening classes. You may attend the day sessions when you are working evenings and then change to the evening sessions when you are working days.


ENGLISH, MATH, & SCIENCE UPGRADING MORNING, AFTERNOON OR EVENING
