



- Pick up an application form at the College Career Centre, Admissions Office or at any Secondary School Counselling Office.
- Mail your application to the Terrace Campus, or bring it in with copies of your school or college transcripts and the deposit required for your program.
- Wait for confirmation of your acceptance. Your deposit will be returned if for any reason, you cannot be accepted. If the program is full, you may use your deposit to reserve a seat for future intakes.
- Two weeks before the start of classes, complete the registration process and pay the balance of your fees. We take VISA, Mastercard, cash or Spanish Doubloons!.
