CANCELLATION POLICY

The College reserves the right to cancel courses with insufficient enrollment. Full refunds will be made only if a course is cancelled by the College or if a student withdraws from a course for medical or bereavement reasons prior to the course start date. Refunds requested prior to the course start date will be charged a \$10 administration fee. There will be no refunds for courses with tuition fees of \$10 or less except for those conditions described above.

PART-TIME COURSES

(Including all part-time Community Adult Education and Vocational Courses)
Withdrawal before the second class - 80% of tuition fees less a \$10 administration charge.
Withdrawal after the second class of course - NO REFUND.

Special registration and refund policies apply to special courses and workshops. NO REFUNDS will be made after the pre-registration date unless the space can be sold to another student, in which case the withdrawing student will be refunded 100% of the tuition fees less a \$10 administration charge.

ACADEMIC (Part-time & Fulltime)

A \$10 "late registration" charge will be assessed to any student registering after the second class or after the second week in standard semester classes. Withdrawal after third or fourth week of class - 50% of tuition less \$10. Withdrawal after the fourth week - NO REFUND.

VOCATIONAL (Fulltime)

Vocational fulltime fees are assessed on a weekly basis, payable by semester. Refunds on withdrawal before completion will be 100% of the unused tuition less \$10.
