Northwest Community College will be conducting a Summer Institute in Terrace from July 6-24, 1998 and will present courses for the ECE Special Needs Educator Certificate and the Special Education Assistant Certificate Program.

Special Education Assistant students will be able to access 2 courses during this time. Courses are now in the development stage and details will be available by Spring 1998.

Early Childhood Education practitioners can work towards completion of their Special Needs Educator Certificate.

Details of the timetable will be available from the Admissions office by April 1998. Students may enroll in ECE 250 and ECE 255 OR ECE 251 or ECE 252 during the three week institute. Students in a Practicum must complete criminal record search Schedule "E" and have current documentation with regards to immunization and health status prior to enrollment.

SUBSIDY for travel, accommodation and child care will be available for out of town ECE students through the Support Child Care Transition Project.

Effective January 1, 1998, all working divers must have an occupational certification. If you are a new diver this certification must be from a commercial diving school approved by the WCB. Divers presently working without this certification must be upgraded following the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations BC Regulation 296/97.

All divers must apply to the WCB for approval to take this course. It is the participant's/employer's responsibility to provide documentation to qualify

for this upgrade to the prerequisites set by WCB. Upon successful completion of an exam, divers will receive WCB "Unrestricted Occupational Scuba Diver Certification." NWCC's instruction is provided by CODA, Canadian Occupational Divers Agency. CODA has been approved by the WCB of BC to upgrade working scuba divers to the WCB occupational scuba diver standard.
