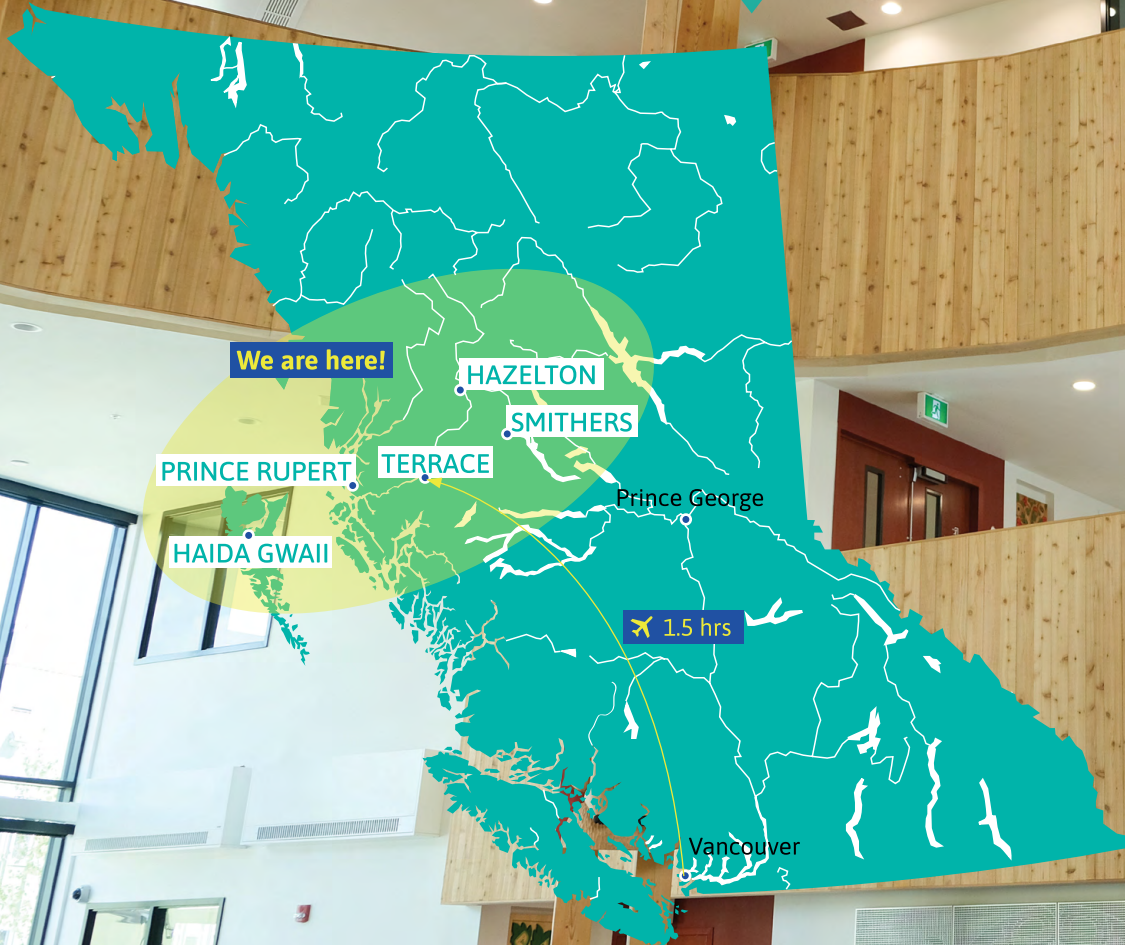

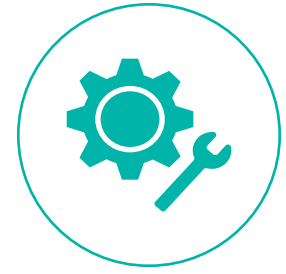

Campus Locations



Terrace

Our largest campus is in Terrace. It is surrounded by mountains and has easy access to the city centre by bus, car, or bicycle.

We have two food service locations on campus. The cafeteria is open for lunch, and the Cedar Café is open most of the day for snacks and specialty coffees, and offers a bright, open study space.

Our library is newly renovated with meeting spaces for group projects as well as quiet study areas. Don't hesitate to ask the library staff for assistance with research skills and library resources. They're very supportive.

At the south end of the campus stands Waap Galts'ap (Community House). This longhouse is used for student-centred and cultural activities. The Terrace campus is located on the unceded traditional territory of the Kitsumkalum, Ts'ymsyan First Nation.

Prince Rupert

Our Prince Rupert campus is located in the heart of the city, right on the coast. It has first-rate science labs and a unique innovation lab where students can develop new uses for technology.

The campus is modern, with a large library, seminar rooms, trades facilities, and a Learning Resource Centre where you can get help from learning specialists. It is just a short walk to local restaurants, and parks making this a vibrant campus location. Enjoy the fresh ocean air and lots of cultural activities in town when you need a break from your studies. The Prince Rupert campus resides on unceded Ts'ymsyan traditional territory.



Smithers

Our Smithers campus is bright and airy. It is conveniently located in downtown Smithers with mountain views and nearby shops and services. The classrooms, labs, workshops, and library support a range of courses in business, trades, health, upgrading, and continuing studies. Our Smithers campus is located on the traditional unceded territory of the Wet'suwet'en people.

Hazelton

Our Hazelton campus is our coziest. Located in the shadow of Stegyoden Mountain, the Hazelton campus is located on the traditional, unceded territory of the Gitksan people. Often the staff and students gather together for lunch. The team here takes great pride in their connection to the community and knows everyone who studies here by name.

Haida Gwaii

Through our mobile training unit, a Contact North learning centre in Old Masset, our field schools, and our campus space in Masset, CMTN is able to offer a variety of training opportunities to communities on Haida Gwaii. Haida Gwaii is the ancestral, unceded territory of the Haida Nation. The Island is spectacular for its scenery, culture, and natural abundance.

Contact North BC

Contact North BC is a pilot project to provide more access to education in rural and remote communities. It started in Ontario and is now growing in British Columbia. Student Housing

Wii Gyemsiga Siwilaawksat means “where learners are content or comfortable”.

Students studying at the Terrace campus have the option to live where they learn. Completed in 2021, the new building can accommodate 108 students. It includes two suites for visiting families of students, an elders suite, six shared kitchens, a computer lab, an e-sports room, and bicycle storage.

The building also features stunning artwork from local Indigenous artists. “It’s not just student housing, it’s like an art gallery,” says Student Housing Coordinator Anjo Colago. “Each wing of the building has a theme and concept, and each piece of art represents that theme and concept.”

In addition to the structure’s aesthetics, the building has open, comfortable seating for students to study or gather in groups on each level.

The housing fee is \$600 per month and all amenities are included in the rent: WiFi, parking, kitchen and laundry facilities, climate control, bicycle storage, and 24-hour security. Email residence@coastmountaincollege.ca for a housing application.

Coast Mountain College created the Freda Diesing School of Northwest Coast Art to honour, recognize and continue the legacy of Haida artist Freda Diesing. She was a master carver, painter, tireless educator, and champion of First Nations art and culture.

Develop solid foundations in First Nations Northwest Coast Art by learning and practising traditional art forms alongside master artists and instructors. This is the only school of its kind in Canada.

Health & Human Services



Northern Collaborative Baccalaureate Nursing Bachelor of Science in Nursing

Nurses are superheroes: empathetic, brave problem-solvers with excellent communication skills and plenty of science know-how. If this profession is calling you, take your first two years of nursing at CMTN then transfer directly to UNBC to complete your Bachelor of Science in Nursing. At CMTN, our small class sizes, experiential learning opportunities and reasonable tuition will support your success.



Access to Practical Nursing

The Access to Practical Nursing (APN) Program is a bridging program that recognizes the completion of the Health Care Assistant Program and related work experience. Complete the additional 54.5 credits to move your career forward. Graduates of the program can apply to write the Canadian Practical Nurse Examination for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN). The CMTN Practical Nursing Access is accredited through British Columbia College of Nurses and Midwives (BCCNM).



Health Career Access Program

Earn while you learn to become a trained Health Care Assistant. The new Health Career Access Program (HCAP) gives you the opportunity to receive paid education to become a certified Health Care Assistant (HCA).

Health Care Assistants provide personal care in a variety of health care settings, including hospitals, assisted living and long-term care facilities, group homes and community care programs.

All course fees and books are covered and successful applicants are paid for their time attending classes. Earn an annual average provincial salary of \$45,900. Early Childhood Care & Education

According to the StrongerBC Economic Plan, we expect more than 10,000 job openings for certified Early Childhood Educators and assistants in the next 10 years. The Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE) Program gives you the skills and knowledge you need for these jobs in licensed child care facilities.

In this program you'll specialize in the care and education of children from birth to five years old – one of the most important periods in a child's life. You will also get to practise what you learn in class, through a placement in a community setting.



Education Assistant

Complete the Education Assistant program in as little as one year with a combination of online learning and practicum experience in your home community. You'll be qualified to work with children and teens that have exceptionalities. Graduates are fully qualified to apply for work as an Education Assistant in any school district within British Columbia. Students may also use their completed certificate to apply for work at community-based support services agencies.



Social Service Worker

If you want to support people and help them thrive, a career in social service might be just the pathway for you. Consider a Social Service Worker one-year certificate or two-year diploma. You'll learn a broad range of skills in psychology and social service combined with workplace practical experience and be ready for a range of support worker jobs. If you want to continue your education further, you can transfer all your credits from the two-year diploma to UNBC and complete your Bachelor of Social Work degree.



Sciences

A one-year certificate or two-year associate degree in Science can set you up for success. Take general studies, including biology, physics, chemistry, and computer science to get a well-rounded base for scientific studies.

If you have specific interests or career goals, you can choose to specialize in one of the following:

Associate Degree in Science (General Studies or Environmental Geoscience Specialization)

A two-year Associate Degree in Science offers a broad range of options in biology, chemistry, physics, computer science, geography, math, psychology, criminology, anthropology and more. This credential will help you find employment in many different laboratory or research settings. If you discover a passion for a particular subject while you're studying, you can transfer your credits to a BC university to complete a Bachelor of Science degree in that specialty.



Applied Coastal Ecology (ACE) Diploma

No other school in Canada offers a program like ACE. Oceanography, rainforest ecology and stream habitat restoration are just some of the things you'll learn as you prepare for an adventurous science career. While you study, you will have plenty of opportunities to be out in the environment using high-tech equipment and conducting real-world research projects in beautiful Prince Rupert, BC. Want to learn even more? This two-year diploma is transferable to Royal Roads University as the first two years of a Bachelor of Science Degree.



Engineering Certificate

Did you know you can complete the Engineering Certificate at Coast Mountain College and then transfer into the second year of an Engineering Program at any university in British Columbia? The curriculum is the same, but your experience will be superior. 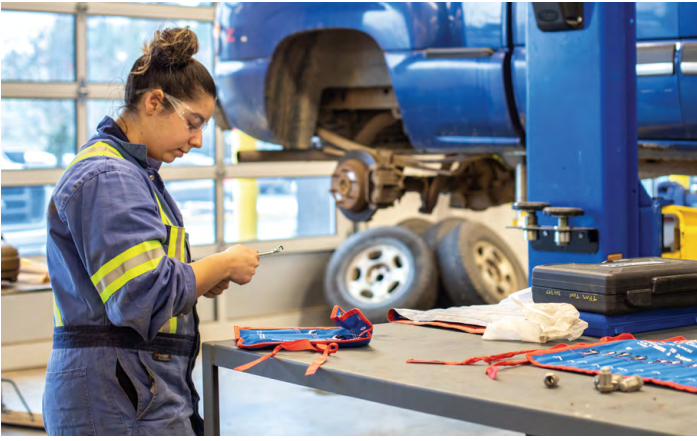
Trades

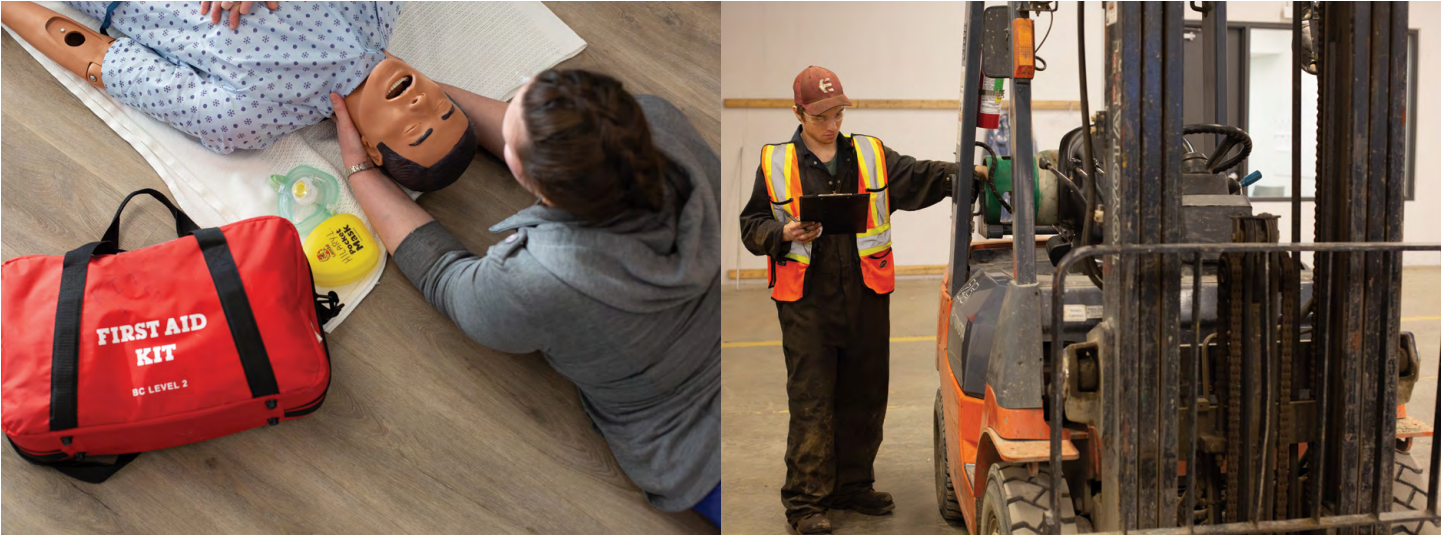
